



The Foundation for Angelman Syndrome Therapeutics (FAST) will be hosting its Annual Global Summit on Angelman Syndrome from Friday, December 4, 2015 through Saturday, December 5, 2015 at the Hyatt Regency Chicago.

This two day event will kick off with Angelman Syndrome science and educational seminars led by the world's leading experts in Angelman Syndrome, followed by a star-studded fundraising Gala with special guest actor & Golden Globe winner **Colin Farrell.** Many other celebrity guests will be announced shortly.

Angelman Syndrome (AS) is a neurodevelopmental disorder affecting approximately 1 in 15,000 live births and is characterized by severe developmental delays, problems with motor coordination and balance (ataxia), and epilepsy. Individuals with AS develop little to no functional speech. In 2007, Dr. Edwin Weeber and colleagues cured AS in the mouse model. Since then, AS research has become an area of intense interest to those aiming to understand and treat neurological disorders. A cure for AS is not only imminent, but stands to be the gateway cure for other disorders such as Fragile X Syndrome, Rett Syndrome and Autism.

FAST is a non-profit charitable organization as described under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. FAST was formed in 2008 and immediately captured the community with a fresh energy, an aggressive approach to AS research, and a concise mission to bring practical treatments into current medical practice as quickly as possible. In January 2011, FAST funded research that identified an FDA approved compound that restored cognition and motor function in the AS mouse model. FAST took this finding from the laboratory to a human clinical trial within one year—a feat unheard of—with relatively little funding, demonstrating the organization's ability to spend raised funds efficiently to produce results that will have the most impact on our children and their families. Since January 2011, FAST has funded over \$3.6 million in AS research. FAST has funded more than \$1.6 million in AS research this year alone.
